Checklist for a Successful Episode

O Include a brief introduction to yourself and the project. (i.e. Hi my name is and my daily routing is (adjective).)
O Include and describe at least 10 typical daily activities (Working in a group requires at least 3 per person)
O Include images illustrating each activity (slides or video)
O Narrate in your own voice the actions being performed (Each person in a group must speak to receive credit for the project)
O Use reflexive and present progressive verb tenses as applicable; most of the verbs in your daily routing should be reflexive, at least one has to be present progressive.
O Clarify the sequence of events e.g. use of <i>primero, después,</i> etc. and/or include the times that the activities happen.
O Use adverbs to say how often something happens e.g. use of siempre, a veces, etc.
O Use Spanish only (except for proper nouns that don't translate).
O Use your class time <u>constructively</u> and meet assigned deadlines.
O Proofread and review presentation- within the group or to Ms. Hall.
O You must <u>provide a transcript</u> for the video and this rubric.
O Make final changes and corrections, then submit by sharing the presentation to: Vanessa.hall@acps.k12.va.us
O If necessary , revise and resubmit.
